### NEED A RIDE? WE PROVIDE!

Paul Phillippe Resource Center has been a public transportation provider since 2005. We take anyone of any age anywhere in Clinton County. We operate Monday-Friday 7 AM-5 PM. We can take you to the doctor, work, Pharmacy, grocery shopping, or anywhere else you need to go in Clinton County. We prefer 24 hour advance notice but will try to accommodate same day transportation. Call a dispatcher at 765-659-4060 to set up your public transportation ride today! We are here to get you where you need to go!



#### **HOW DO I USE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION?**

I think we have been known as the Senior Center for so long that people think our transportation is only for elderly and handicapped individuals. Good news.......It's for anyone of any age .

We can help you get to work, to the grocery store, the doctor's office, Walmart, pharmacy, or other places that you can request. We will take you anywhere in Clinton County and we also go to Lafayette and Lebanon as a courtesy trip. We are working really hard to do more same day trips, so if you have somewhere you need to go on the same day give us a call and let us try to help.

We are funded through the 5311 INDOT program and our local County Commissioners are the pass through for our wonderful program. We are here to serve our community and we operate on a donation basis. We have suggested donation amounts, but you can donate whatever you can afford in order to ride our system.

We are one of the only public transit systems in the state that does not charge a set fee and works on donations. We know that the rising costs of goods, services and gas make it hard for some people to get to much needed appointments. So, let us be your transportation Provider.

If you have questions call and let us explain our system to you or ask us to mail you a rider guide and brochure.


To say I am handling the thought of her leaving my nest empty is the very far
